## MONTANA - NORTH DAKOTA - SOUTH DAKOTA

DATE VISITED: June 25, 1991

**ACCESS ROUTE:** From Buffalo, SD go W 24 miles to Camp Crook, SD. Then go 28 miles N, on a good dirt road, to the ND line, where a double span iron bridge crosses Boxelder Creek. Continue ½ mile beyond the bridge, up on the bench above the creek, where a faint farm road goes left into the pasture. Follow the farm road, along the edge of the bench, and along the edge of fields, heading generally W, for about 2½ miles. The last ½ mile is along the ND - SD fence, in ND, to boundary marker #359. Park and hike due W, past marker #360, to the red granite tri-State marker post dated 1892 about 1.6 miles from marker #359.

The boundary line between ND and SD which is the seventh standard parallel north, of the public land survey, was surveyed in 1891-92 from the Bois de Sioux River, (see also page 17B), to the MT line. Snyder Hill, in Montana, is a prominent landmark WSW about ¼ mile and 150 feet higher than the tri-point.
